Requests for capital support are considered after there is clear evidence that the goal of the campaign will be achieved and that it will be accomplished within a reasonable time period. Lead gifts are rarely granted.

On occasion, the Foundation provides operational support for outstanding programs.

Preference is given to organizations that do not submit proposal requests to the Foundation on a regular or annual basis.

The Foundation does not offer support to/for:

- individuals;
- · religious organizations for sectarian or propagation of faith purposes;
- institutions limiting their services to persons of a single religious sect or denomination;
- · propagandizing, influencing legislation or elections, or promoting voter registration;
- · political candidates, campaigns, or organizations engaged in political activities, or specific advocacy;
- endowed chairs;
- · fellowships, internships, exchanges, or individual scholarships;
- · annual campaigns or regular, ongoing operational support;
- · production of film, video, or other media;
- · deficit financing, loans, or debt reduction;
- grantmaking organizations;
- · traveling exhibits;
- · performance underwriting;
- · seminars, workshops, or surveys;
- · general research and development;
- · support of regional and national charities (specific diseases, national causes, etc.); or,
- · fundraising or award events.

The <u>Health Effects Institute</u> was chartered in 1980 as an independent research organization to provide high-quality, impartial, and relevant science on the health effects of air pollution.

To help advance that mission, HEI welcomes applications for the Walter A. Rosenblith New Investigator Award. Through the program, grants of up to \$500,000 over as many as three years will be awarded in support of research being conducted by early investigators on the health effects of air pollution. Research projects are often interdisciplinary in nature and span a range of scientific fields, including atmospheric science, epidemiology, exposure science, statistics, and toxicology. In considering potential research topics, applicants should be aware of HEI's current priorities (as described in the draft HEI Strategic Plan for the Health Effects of Air Pollution 2020-2025), which this year are focused on four key areas: multipollutant science; accountability and transparency; emerging technologies and fuels; and global health science.


HEI strongly encourages individuals who are underrepresented in environmental exposure and health research to apply and encourages all applicants to diversify their research teams by including underrepresented individuals, including those attuned to and knowledgeable about the communities in which the studies are taking place to the extent appropriate given the study location(s).

Scientists of any nationality holding a PhD, ScD, MD, DVM, or DrPH degree are eligible to apply.

Preliminary applications are due March 24. Upon review, selected applicants will be invited




