Pomona College Sustainability Locations

- Sustainability Integration Office (SIO) This office coordinates the College's sustainability efforts. The SIO also oversees the ReCoop and Green Bikes programs, the laundry rack and compost bucket checkout program, CFL light bulb distribution, and other programs.
- Pendleton Pool By turning down the heaters, covering the pool more often, and shifting use schedules, the College has reduced the energy use of this pool by 40 percent!
- South Campus Athletic Facility This innovative campus development includes light sensors, bioswales for natural water retention, advanced irrigation, native planting, and a solar PV array. (Opening 2011)
- 4 Frank Dining Hall This is the headquarters of Pomona's dining and catering services, which serves a variety of fresh, local foods and a growing amount of organic produce. All unused prepared food is donated to local charities and all kitchen produce scraps from this and other campus eateries are composted at the Farm.
- Organic Farm The College's 2.5-acre organic garden provides educational and extra-curricular experience in sustainable food production. It consists of West Farm (the community garden) and East Farm (the academic garden) and includes bee hives, chickens, an Earth Dome, and more. It is also home of SolTrain, a 1-kW mobile solar array built by students, staff, and faculty.
- Harwood Court Recent renovations have outfitted this building with dual-pane windows, improved high-efficiency plumbing fixtures, efficient light fixtures, light sensors, energy monitoring, and more.
- President's House The president requested a turf-free front lawn in 2008. Grass was replaced with beautiful drought-resistant native plantings.
- Stanley Academic Quad In 2008 the College unveiled the new Academic Quad complete with drought-tolerant plants, bioswales and a elimination of 5,000 square feet of turf.

- Seaver Biology Building This was the College's first LEED certified building (Silver level), and is topped with the College's first solar PV array. The building features a "cool roof," efficient plumbing fixtures, runoff-retention technology, drought-resistant landscaping and more.
- Seaver South Laboratory Renovated in 2008, this building now includes more efficient lighting, ventilation and air conditioning, along with "light shelves" that reduce solar heat gain (reducing AC) and improve natural daylighting.
- Alexander Hall/President's Office Pomona has taken a leadership role in sustainability, from creating the President's Advisory Committee on Sustainability in 2006 to creating a sustainability audit and a full-time sustainability coordinator position in 2008. In 2010-11, the College is launching its first Sustainability Action Plan to guide future actions.
- Smith Campus Center This is the hub of campus activity, featuring the Recycling Center for items like electronic waste, batteries, printer cartridges and more. Get a discount for bringing your own mug into the Sagehen Cafe, and check out a folding bike from the ATM room!
- Lincoln Edmunds This was the College's second LEED certified project (Gold level), featuring an 88.2 kW solar PV array, water-efficient landscaping, high-efficiency plumbing fixtures, local building materials, and more. This is also home to the Environmental Analysis Program.
- Cowart IT Building This is the home of ITS, which stocks the College with energy-saving EPEAT-rated computers and which includes an efficient data center designed for savings!
- Walker Lounge This is the site of On The Loose, the Claremont outdoor adventure organization, and ReCoop, which collects all of the items left behind by students at the end of the year (which would otherwise go to the landfill) and sells them back to incoming first-years at the end of the summer.

- Green Bikes Shop This student-run bike shop checks out over 60 bikes to students each semester, free of charge, and provides free labor for bike repairs. Green Bikes also hosts bike workshops and events throughout the year.
- Norton-Clark III In 2009, this residence hall was renovated with high-efficiency light fixtures, dual-flush toilets, light sensors, energy-free exit signs and other eco-friendly features.
- Frary Dining Hall Along with its sustainable dining programs (see Frank Dining Hall), in 2009 this dining hall was retrofitted with hundreds of tiny CFLs in its massive chandeliers.
- North Campus Residence Halls Pomona's first LEED-certified residence halls (expected Gold-level certification) will feature efficient lighting, ventilation, plumbing and appliances with a thermal mass design to reduce heating and cooling needs. They will also have a rooftop garden, a solar hot water heating system, and a solar PV array to provide electricity, and will be surrounded by natural landscape and a stormwater drain into the Wash. (Opening 2011)
- Haldeman Pool Featuring an ultra-efficient variable speed pump system and a solar hot water heating system, Haldeman is one of the greenest college pools in the country!
- The Wash/Blanchard Park This part of campus is a dedicated preserve that naturally recharges the aquifer and is a showcase of the regions natural flora and fauna. The Wash is also home to the Farm and the Sontag Greek Theatre.
- Bernard Field Station This site contains over 75 acres of coastal sage scrub, live oak forest, and grassland that serve as a valuable natural laboratory for Claremont Colleges students.
- Zipcar Locations Pomona is home to 13
 Zipcars, fuel-efficient vehicles available for hourly rental. These vehicles help reduce cars on campus and raise awareness about car sharing programs.
