INNOVATIVE OFFERINGS

- Hosts the Summer Institute on Leadership for Educational Justice annually; the day-long event includes panels and talks on educational theory, equity, and policy development for superintendents and teachers from 11 school districts
- Examines educational justice internationally; each year, at least one group of students travels abroad, with visits to Haiti, New Zealand, the Philippines, Cuba, China, and Scotland in the past five years
- Introduced a career expo for those seeking careers in the field of education; employers from various educational organizations such as the Los Angeles and San Bernardino City Unified School Districts engaged with U of R students on campus
- Offers three online graduate degree programs—in learning and teaching; human services; and curriculum and instructional design—in addition to its many on-ground programs.
