FIELDWORK AND CULMINATING EXPERIENCES

Fieldwork

Student in the College track program must complete a minimum of 600 fieldwork hours at a minimum of two different sites. 400 of the 600 hours must be completed in a college setting (community college or university). Students may conduct hours at the same institution provided they are earned at two different offices or departments. It is recommended that students pursuing the College track conduct 200 hours in a high school or a high school-to-college transition setting. Co-current enrollment in EDUC 677 A, B, or C is required.

As part of the required fieldwork hours, students must complete at least 100 hours of experience in each of the following areas: Social/Emotional, College/Career, and Academic. A minimum of 150 hours must be devoted to issues of diversity.

Comprehensive Exam

Students must pass the Counselor Preparation Comprehensive Exam (CPCE) in order to complete program requirements. See Handbook for more information.

Commencement Ceremony Participation

School of Education students complete program requirements at various points throughout the year. The Commencement ceremony occurs in April. Students may apply to participate in the academic year in which they complete their program requirements as long as they do so by August 31. Eligible students **must apply** for commencement via Student Planning Portal by January 31.
